Gun Show report: a 270 Winchester short Mag will be raffled off at the door only.

Youth Sportsfest: Jim said that 127 kids had signed up. 5 people volunteered to call the kids on the list.

Concealed Carry: Richard Moore announced that there would be an implementations meeting held in Santa Fe October 13<sup>th</sup>. (This was later moved to October 15<sup>th</sup>) Some of the concerns he expressed were; if you submit your application (with it's \$100 fee) and don't get it right, they will send your application back to fix. You will have 20 days to resubmit the application. If you don't get it right that time, you will have 20 days to resubmit the application. If you screw it up a third time, it will go in the trash and they will keep your \$100 fee. You can go ahead and apply again but you will have to send in another \$100 with the new application.

Another concern; your competency certificate of completion for the class that is required will only be good for 90 days.

The initial competency certification class will be 15 hours long with a 4 hour refresher class required every 2 years for renewal.

Targets will be 12" X 18". You will have 50 rounds with each round worth 2 points. (100 points total) Shooting lines will be at 3, 7, and 15 yards with a minimum of 76 points to pass.

You must qualify with all caliber and types you wish to list on your permit.

Instructors will be required to provide a description of their experience.

And they are also dictating what qualifies as a classroom.

A motion to spend \$1500 to build up the pistol berms to 20' was made. This is a safety issue and will be voted on at the next meeting. The outdoor range still needs help.

The Tres Rios Banditos had 10 stages, 43 cowboys and cowgirls at their shoot Labor Day weekend. Our Mayor came out and there were \$2000 worth of prizes given away. It was a "great shoot and a lot of fun."

Wayland Moore wanted to thank all of the match directors for all their efforts.
