(see announcements) New Mexico came in 5<sup>th</sup> overall. They also said that they will be able to return some of the donation to the club.

Shotgun Match Director Dave Brooks talked about the summer trap league and more. (see announcements). Remember you can still join the summer league and make up the rounds.

Youth Sports Fest Director Anna Kinney talked about the things we still need for the Youth Sports Fest. (mostly volunteers). We will also need .22 rifles, 12ga, 20ga, and .410 shotguns as well as pellet rifles. The Sports Fest will be held August 28<sup>th</sup>. The kids have a great time and so do the volunteers.

Executive Range Officer Wayland Moore said that vandalism is on the rise and there have been \$1600 damage done in just the last few months. He is going to

have some heads on a block because this is ridiculous. Someone shot one of our toilets, and a plastic trash can with a shotgun. And there was a wood spool with carpet down in the East Canyon that was all shot up too. Not to mention the fences have been cut in numerous places. This is our club and we all have to be responsible for watching out what goes on. If the gate is closed when you get here, close the gate behind you! (The gate is to remain open for matches and trap shooting times only.) There have been non-members found shooting on the range. Someone took out some of the steel silhouette targets from the fenced area and shot them up. These targets cost about \$75 each! Just a few things that are happening at the trap range. We just about have our shade unit put up, thanks to Roger Dunston and Billy Stallcup. We are also selling raffle tickets to raise more money to help put in trap houses 3 and 4, because we are going to have registered trap shoots next year. And believe me people that this will help bring in a considerable amount of money that will in turn help the whole club in making improvements to insure that we have one of the premier clubs in the
