2006 DUES CHANGES

If you’ve been reading the last several newsletters or attended any of the last few general meetings, you are well aware of the dues changes for 2006. But just in case you missed any of these....

The San Juan Wildlife Federation maintains an affiliation with the National Rifle Association (NRA). To maintain that affiliation, the club membership must be composed of a minimum of 50% NRA members. This allows the Club to use NRA insurance and at a very reduced premium. None of us could afford the SJWF dues if we had to have outside insurance for the Federation.

You don’t even have to expend much effort to become an NRA member — just see La Veta Hawk, our membership clerk, at any general meeting to join the NRA and (1) receive a reduced \$10 discount if you are just joining the NRA and a \$5 discount if you are renewing the NRA through the Wildlife Federation. (2) Joining the NRA will enable you to receive a reduced membership dues of \$55 per year instead of \$110. Renewal of SJWF membership will require members to attend a general meeting and show their current NRA card to qualify for the 50% discounted rate. Call LaVeta 632-2550 with questions.

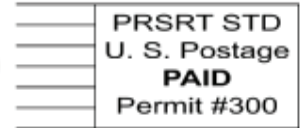
