I was born in a farm house north of Paxton, NE, January 15, 1934. I grew up on a wheat and cattle ranch south of Paxton and was carrying a .22, shooting prairie dogs and rabbits before I was 10. After graduating from Paxton High in 1952, I joined the Navy. Four years later, after a tour on the South Seas Island of Guam, never aboard a ship, I headed to the University of Wyoming in Laramie, where I obtained a BS in Petroleum Engineering in 1960. I met my wife, Isabell there and we were wed in June of 1959. Upon graduation I went to work for the Department of Interior, USGS in Casper, WY. Twenty eight years later after working in WY, MT, ND, AK, LA, and NM, I retired in Albuquerque. Sold the house and lived and traveled in an RV for fourteen months going from the northern most part of Main to Key West to California and on to Alaska, finally settling in Farmington in 1990.

In the meantime, we had two daughters, Ann and family now living in Tulare, CA, where she is a teacher, and Barb and son living in Merritt Island, FL, where she is an Engineer with NASA. I have one granddaugh-

ter, Brandie in CA and grandson, Timmy in FL.

After nearly 50 years of marriage, my wife passed away about 18 months ago. She had a BS in Nursing and worked in Farmington for a number or years until her health forced her to retire.

I started shooting competitive small-bore gallery rifle, and high power

rifle while living in Billings, MT in the "70s. After moving to California, I continued shooting High Power and started shooting small bore prone matches. I also became a NRA Certified Rifle instructor and formed a junior club, training both of my daughters in the process. I obtained Master ratings in High Power, Small bore prone, Small Bore 4 position gallery rifle and Expert in gallery pistol.

After joining the SJWF in 1990, I became active in Hunter Pistol Silhouette and Gallery Pistol, being Match Director of both for awhile. I have served on the Board for a number of years, several years ago and am now on the current Board. I started Cowboy Action Shooting about 12 years ago and find it to be the most fun of all the shooting sports. Our Long Range Matches are a great challenge and reminds one of what they did back then. The social activities and costuming really set this sport apart from the others. I am a Territorial Governor representing our Bandidos to SASS (Single Action Shooting Society) and am almost forced to attend the annual meeting in Las Vegas every December!

I have done well in this competition, winning the Elder Statesman category New Mexico State Championship twice, Arizona once (but didn't get the buckle since I wasn't a resident) and second at Winter Range, the National Championships in Phoenix. I have also placed in the top 10 (in category) at End of Trail, the World Championship.

I love to hunt and fish as much as I do shooting. I grew up hunting pheasants, quail and ducks in Nebraska, Pronghorns, deer and elk in Wyoming and Montana, taking a Mountain Goat while in Montana. Last year I made the trip of a lifetime by going to South Africa for plains game. Except, I am making one more "trip of a lifetime" by heading to Namibia the middle of August, hoping to add more plains game to the list.

I have built over a dozen fly rods and have used them for catching a variety of fish. Besides trout fishing in the Rockies, I have caught bone fish in the Bahamas and salmon, including a 50 pounder, in Alaska.
