INDOOR SHOOT: We are considering adding a new indoor RIFLE shoot.

This shoot is for .22 LR rifles or air rifles. Single shot, lever action, semiautomatics, bolt-action magazine fed, and air rifles are all acceptable for this new shoot.

Shooters will have the choice of several targets, both for open sights or scopes: Silhouette, predator, and prey. The shoot consists of four 5 minute relays of ten shots each. Thus a minimum of 40 rounds are necessary. The fee is \$5.00 to shoot.

Should there be enough interest to begin this shoot, it will be scheduled for Tuesday nights with the shooting to begin at 7 p.m. except on the third Tuesday of each month when the monthly club meeting is scheduled.

WILD BUNCH COMPETITIONS:

First, Wild Bunch competition is not Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS) with a 1911 pistol. It is a separate shooting competition; however, some of the SASS (Single Action Shooting Society) rules are used. As with CAS, there are clothing and accouterments requirements.

Costuming adds a uniqueness to our game and helps create a festive, informal atmosphere that supports the friendly, fraternal feeling we encourage in our competitors.

Clothing worn must be typical of the late 19th century and early 20th century cowboy and military i.e., US military from 1900 to 1916, period western dress such as Pike, Dutch, Lyle or Tector in the closing scene of the Wild Bunch movie.

Jeans, western shirts, cowboy hat, but no ball caps or running shoes or boots with lug soles.

Firearms required are a Model 1911 pistol, lever action rifle in a pistol caliber of 40 caliber or larger and a 12 ga. Winchester Model 1897 shotgun. The military version is allowed. Lead bullet ammo is required and for the pistol and rifle there is a 150 power factor. There are 2 categories, Traditional and Modern. The basic difference is Traditional has fixed sights and must be shot one handed, Modern can have adjustable sights.

We will shooting Wild Bunch matches the second Sunday of the month. Winter hours: set up at 9am, shooting starting at 10am in the lower shooting bays with the Cowboy props. It is a timed event. The Board and Officers would also like to thank the member who anonymously donated the gift cards for Olive Garden.

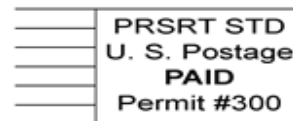
